HOW WOULD YOU LIKE TO EARN WAGES WHILE YOU LEARN A TRADE?

- § Do you like to be able to see the work you've done at the end of the day?
- § Do you take pride in providing quality work that meets demanding standards?
- § Do you like to work as part of a team?
- § Do you like to work outdoors?
- § Are you willing to do physically demanding work that requires you to use your mind too?
- § Would you like to earn a respectable wage while going to school to learn new skills and perhaps even a college degree?
- § Are you interested in a career rather than "just a job?"
- § Do you enjoy new challenges?

Apprentices earn while they learn, working on the job alongside the Journeymen. In addition they attend classes of related and supplemental instruction, a minimum of 144 hours of related classroom instruction per year for four (4) years.

Starting wages for ironworker apprentices are 60% of a journeyman's wage. As an apprentice accumulates an established number of on-the-job hours plus related and supplemental instruction hours, wages are increased at regular intervals.

Graduating apprentices attain journeyman status and receive full pay for the skills they have earned.

REQUIREMENTS:

Minimum 18 years of age, High School diploma / GED, Proof of Birth, Social Security Card, Driver License, Pass a drug test and Physically able to do the work
